FESTIVAL CANCELLATION POLICY

If there is a school closure in Western School Division due to a storm day, scheduled Festival classes will be cancelled. If Western School Division announces a school closure due to extreme cold, Festival classes will continue as scheduled, EXCEPT for Band, Choral, and Speech Arts. We will make every effort to reschedule cancelled classes, subject to adjudicator availability. School cancellations will be announced on The Eagle 93.5 and pembinavalleyonline.com. Festival changes can also be found on mordenfestivalofthearts.com.

DEFINITIONS AND REGULATIONS

The items listed in this addendum are exceptions or additions to those listed in the current Provincial Syllabus. Morden Festival of the Arts adheres to the regulations of the Provincial Syllabus 2023 Edition. Participants and teachers must be familiar with those rules as well as the specific policies at the beginning of each section. The decision of the Morden Festival of the Arts Executive in all matters arising out of and not provided for in these regulations shall be final.

GENERAL Morden Festival of the Arts REGULATIONS
(Addendum to Provincial Syllabus 2023 Edition)

1. All classes shall be open to all performers, whether residents of Morden or not.
2. Incomplete entries will not be accepted.
3. All entries must be performed as entered.
4. All entries must be accompanied with the required fee.
5. In the event of a withdrawal, there shall be no refund of the entry fee. The executive would appreciate early notice of any withdrawal.
6. In classes where the age limit is specified, the performer's age is to be taken as of December 31st of the previous year.
7. No individual shall be allowed to participate in more than one entry in any one class except in Band.
8. Participants must not repeat their own performances from the previous year's festival.
9. Students must enter in the grade level at which they are presently studying, or higher as of January 1st unless age is specified.
10. NO ONE may use the festival halls for practice during any festival sessions.
11. A copy of all musical selections, labeled with performer's class number, name, and (if in book form) page number or selection must be numbered, beginning with the first complete measure. Participants may reclaim their music from the festival librarian only after the end of their class.
12. A conductor of any festival choir may be amateur or professional; however, he/she must not sing, recite, or play with his/her choir.
13. Any complaints must be made in writing only, directly to the secretary while the festival is in session.
14. No recording during adjudication.
15. No recording without the permission of the performer/s. No recording of groups is allowed without the express permission of **every** person in the group.
16. Taped music should not be used in place of an accompanist.
17. Participants may use test pieces for all solo, duet and sacred classes only once.
18. Own choice selections for all solo, duet and sacred classes may be used only once.
19. All copyrights regarding music must be observed. Photocopied/handwritten material will not be accepted except where an entrant produces a letter from the publisher. Legal digital copies will be accepted along with a receipt for their purchase. Original Scores - Performers are encouraged to perform from memory, but when a score is required, it must be an original and not a photocopy. All entrants must provide an original of their selection for the adjudicator's use. Legal electronic downloads must be accompanied by a receipt, with the exception of music downloaded from IMSLP (Public domain source). The performer will be ineligible for awards when unauthorized photocopies are used. Entrants providing selections for the adjudicator's use must have their books open and marked with their name and the class number. All music that is in loose page format must be presented stapled together or bound in some way.

20. Photocopies of music are not allowed except where an entrant produces a letter from the publisher giving permission to photocopy. • where an entrant produces correspondence from the publisher or music supplier, dated 60 days prior, stating the item is backordered and payment has been received.
21. Accompaniment - The intent of Morden Festival of the Arts and the Provincial Finals is to have live performances by both the performer and the piano accompanist; however, some situations may require modification of this rule and will be assessed on an individual basis. Morden Festival of the Arts will not be obligated to provide a sound system if needed.
22. Access Copyright License - Festival participants may reproduce selections from the Speech Arts manual or other source as described in the Provincial Syllabus 2023 Edition. All entrants in Speech Arts classes must provide the adjudicator with an original or a photocopy of each selection.
23. Competitors in ensemble classes must choose the division corresponding to or higher than their solo entry/entries. If two or more competitors are in different age categories, they must enter the higher age category in ensemble classes.
24. The Morden Festival of the Arts requires that competitors in all solo classes must perform in two or more solo classes at the same grade/age group in the same discipline to be eligible for a Provincial Final recommendation. One of these classes must be a Provincial Finals eligible class.
25. Please note that first place winners of Provincial Finals Music classes may now be eligible to compete at the same level provided they are recommended from a local festival class one grade higher than the previous year.
26. Provincial Recommendation - Adjudicators may recommend one or two representatives (and an alternate) at each level indicated from each of the eligible disciplines. See page 15 for more information.

Marking

As a general guide, the following marking system is used:

Grade	Mark	Performance Standard
A +	90 to 100	signifies superior performance
A	85 to 89	signifies distinction
A -	80 to 84	signifies definite merit
B	75 to 79	signifies adequate
C	70 to 74	signifies fair standard

The decision of the adjudicator regarding marking of participants must be accepted as final. At no time must anyone approach the adjudicator to discuss any matter.

Verbal adjudication will be given individually or as the adjudicator decides.

The Morden Festival of the Arts does not announce marks at Festival sessions, nor are there any class winners. Marks are recorded on the adjudication sheets and are used in the assessment of awards.

A letter grade will be recorded on certificates in Speech Arts, Vocal, and Strings. A percentage mark will be recorded on Piano certificates.

Provincial eligible classes begin with the letter “P”. Read the Provincial Syllabus 2023 Edition for more detailed information.

1. General Procedures

Morden Festival of the Arts Classes: The Festival committee will consider creating new classes to accommodate entries not eligible in existing classes. Note: Requests for new classes must be submitted by September 1 to be considered for the following year's festival.

Programming: The order of performances and approximate times will be shown in the official festival program. Programs will be available for purchase, prior to the end of February, at Morden Pharmasave and the Morden Branch of South-Central Regional Library.

The Morden Festival of the Arts Executive reserves the right to grant or deny requests for program changes.

Requests for Scheduling Changes: All requests for scheduling changes must be received in writing (email or letter form; NO text messages), at least two weeks before the discipline start date.

Send requests to Morden Festival of the Arts, Box 493, Morden, MB R6M 1P9 or hand deliver to the discipline coordinator. Emailed requests should be sent to mordenfestivalofthearts@gmail.com. These requests will be evaluated by the Discipline Coordinators. Please state your circumstances clearly in written form.

AWARD/SCHOLARSHIP PROCEDURE

Awards will be presented at the discretion of the Awards Committee to deserving performers. Participants must perform in two or more solo classes in a given discipline of the festival to be eligible.

Non-competitive entries and entries in the following Multi-Age/Multi-Level classes will not be eligible for awards:

Strings: MS1000 Strings Multi-Age

Piano: MK1000 Piano Multi-Age

Vocal: MV1000 Vocal Multi-Age

Speech Arts: MSA1000 Speech Arts Multi-Age

Awards shall be restricted to participants 18 years and younger. Awards can be presented in more than one discipline to the same performer. The Festival encourages the use of these scholarships towards tuition at music camps, private lessons, purchase of music or musical instruments, books, art supplies or any other area which would further artistic development.

Due to the financial support of a member of our community, Sacred selections are also considered for Sacred Awards. The availability of Sacred Awards are assessed on a yearly basis. These marks will also be considered as a second solo selection for Solo Awards.

Sacred Music Scholarship

- Strings: Beginner to Level 4 - \$40.00, Strings Level 5 and up - \$50.00, Ensemble - \$25.00 /performer
- Vocal: 12 yrs & under - \$40.00, 18 yrs & under - \$50.00, Ensemble - \$25.00/performer
- Piano: Beginner to Grade 4 - \$40.00, Grade 5 & up - \$50.00, Ensemble - \$25.00/performer

Beginners and Preliminary Performers, Quick Studies, Sight-Reading, Choirs, Speech Choirs, and Band groups are not considered for awards.

Loreena McKennitt Award

- Sponsored by the Morden Festival of the Arts
- Recognition of \$200.00 will be awarded to a music student who has potential and may pursue music as a career

Scholarship for Duet, Trio or Quartet Performance

- One possible award to be presented in each discipline to deserving students that have performed in a duet, trio or quartet in any one of the performing arts disciplines of our festival. To be eligible, each participant in the group must have performed in at least one other class in the same discipline.

To be eligible for Provincial Finals or a Morden Festival scholarship, a performer at our local Festival must meet one of the following criteria:

1. Must be a resident of Morden & District
2. Must be taught by a teacher in Morden & District

PROVINCIAL RECOMMENDATIONS

As a member of the Associated Manitoba Arts Festivals (AMAF), the Morden Festival of the Arts is eligible to send representatives to the Provincial Finals to be held in spring 2024. Adjudicators may recommend one or two representatives (and an alternate) at each level as indicated in the AMAF Provincial Syllabus.
